We have great news for all who have been anxiously waiting to hear about our vaccine clinic! We are going to have a vaccine clinic scheduled in May at The Pines, Tuesday May 14<sup>th</sup> 10:00 a.m. We will be sending out consent forms that will need to be signed and returned. Pharmacy have reviewed resident's charts and indicated vaccines that are due on the consent forms. You will also have an option to get the newest Covid booster vaccine that is recommended by the CDA at this time. If you would like to get it, you must mark that box. The drop off area at our front door **is not** a parking spot. Yes this means you!



This turn around area is meant for emergency vehicles and a car parked in that area in front of our door unattended could potentially affect a life or death situation. Emergency vehicles, personal and equipment need complete access in and out for emergencies. If time is of the essence your loved one could be the one adversely affected by delays in accessing our building.

You may not park, bring someone in the building and quick run them back to their apartment. You may not park, go in and get your resident ready then walk them down to front door. You have now left the car parked unattended in the emergency entrance. If your loved one needs assistance to or from the door you must first park in a parking spot

There are seven plus one handicapped parking spaces in front and ample free parking in the ramp on the north end of our building where there is easy access to our building.

Visitors if you leave your car unattended for any length of time in front of our main entrance police will be called and you will be ticketed.
